

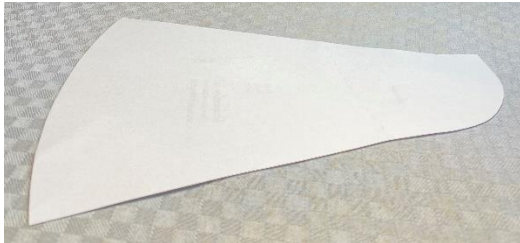
## Tutorial for Bathing Poncho (53 "Summer – 11.5 inch Fashion Dolls")

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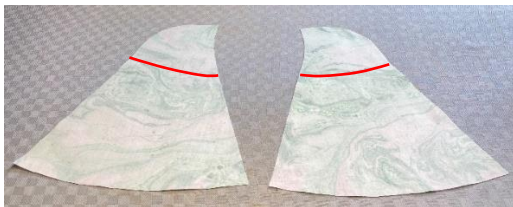
*The poncho can be made of many different types of fabric. The fabric does not have to be stretchy. In this tutorial I used a thin woven fabric.*

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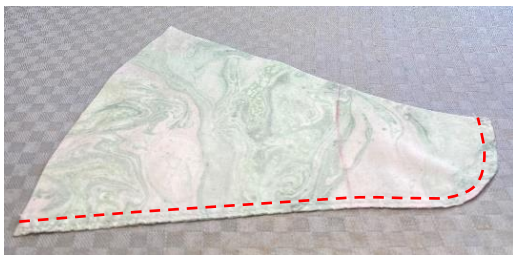
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1. You need this pattern part.



2. Cut out these two parts. Mark the dotted line on the wrong side of the fabric.



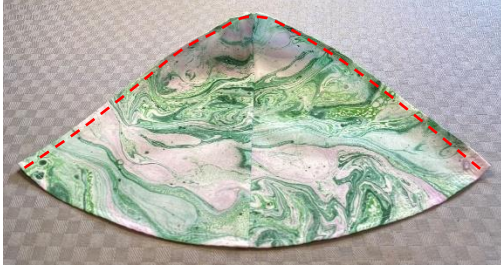
3. Sew the rear curved part and zigzag the sewing allowance together. (Do NOT zigzag if you use elastic fabric, e.g. cotton jersey.)



4. Zigzag all free edges. (Do NOT zigzag if you use elastic fabric.)



5. Fold the lower ¼ inch (7 mm) hem and sew.



6. Fold the other  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch (7 mm) hem and sew.



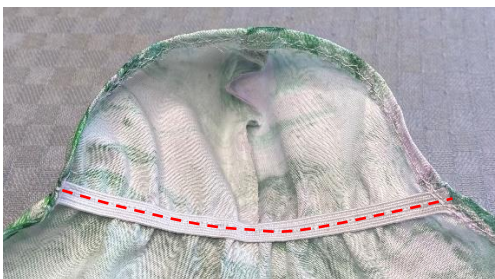
7. Now you need  $\frac{3}{16}$  inch (5 mm) wide elastic. Cut a  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inch (11 cm) piece. Mark the middle with a pin.



8. Attach one end of the elastic to the hem (on the dotted line) with a small zigzag stitch. Attach the middle of the elastic to the mid back of the poncho using a pin. Pull on the elastic while sewing with a straight stitch.



9. When you have reached the mid back, attach the free end of the elastic to the other edge of the poncho and keep sewing while pulling on the elastic. Attach the end securely, for example using a small zigzag.



10. This is how it looks when the elastic is sewn.



11. Sew a small snap or a small piece of velcro, see picture.



12. Finished!
